

Sheet Pan Olive Bar Chicken

Recipe Ingredients:

- 8-10-Fingerling Potatoes cut in half
- 2 tbsp-Olive oil
- **1 tsp**-Salt, divided
- 2 lbs-Boneless, skinless chicken thighs
- 1-Lemon, sliced
- 1-Small red onion, cut lengthwise into 8 wedges
- **1 lb**-Olive bar offerings (peppers, olives, roasted garlic, marinated artichoke hearts etc.)
- half a tsp-Pepper
- 1 tsp-Onion powder

Instructions:

- 1. Preheat the oven to 375° F.
- 2. Space out the potatoes onto a rimmed baking sheet. Cover lightly with 1 tablespoon olive oil and half teaspoon sea salt. Toss to coat. Roast in the oven for 15 minutes.
- 3. When the potatoes have been roasting for 15 minutes, remove them from the oven. Add everything else (including the remaining olive oil and salt) to the pan with the potatoes, using a spatula to toss it all together. Spread the ingredients out evenly and roast for 35 minutes longer until the chicken is cooked through.

BOY'S LAGBOSSE


