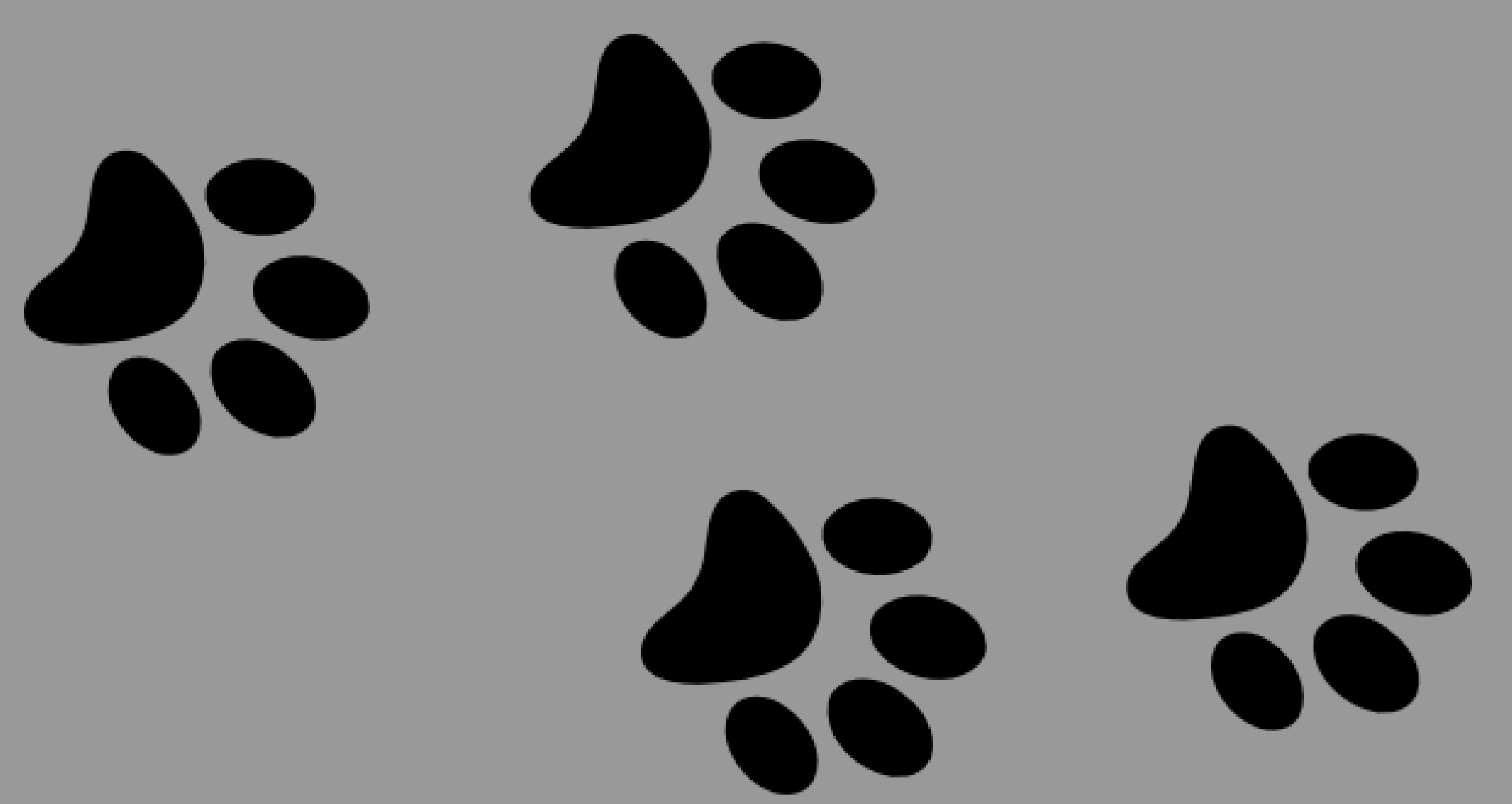
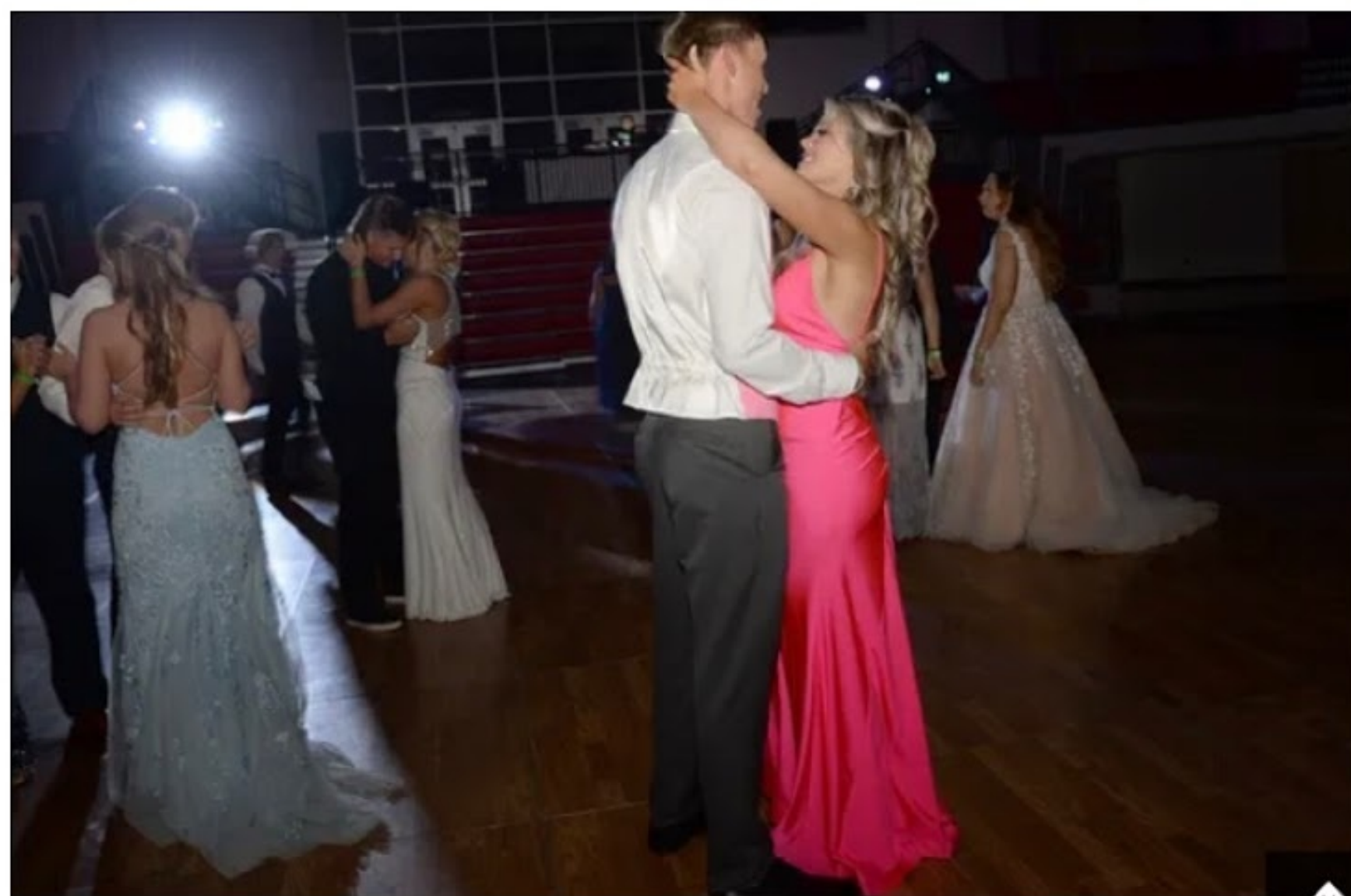

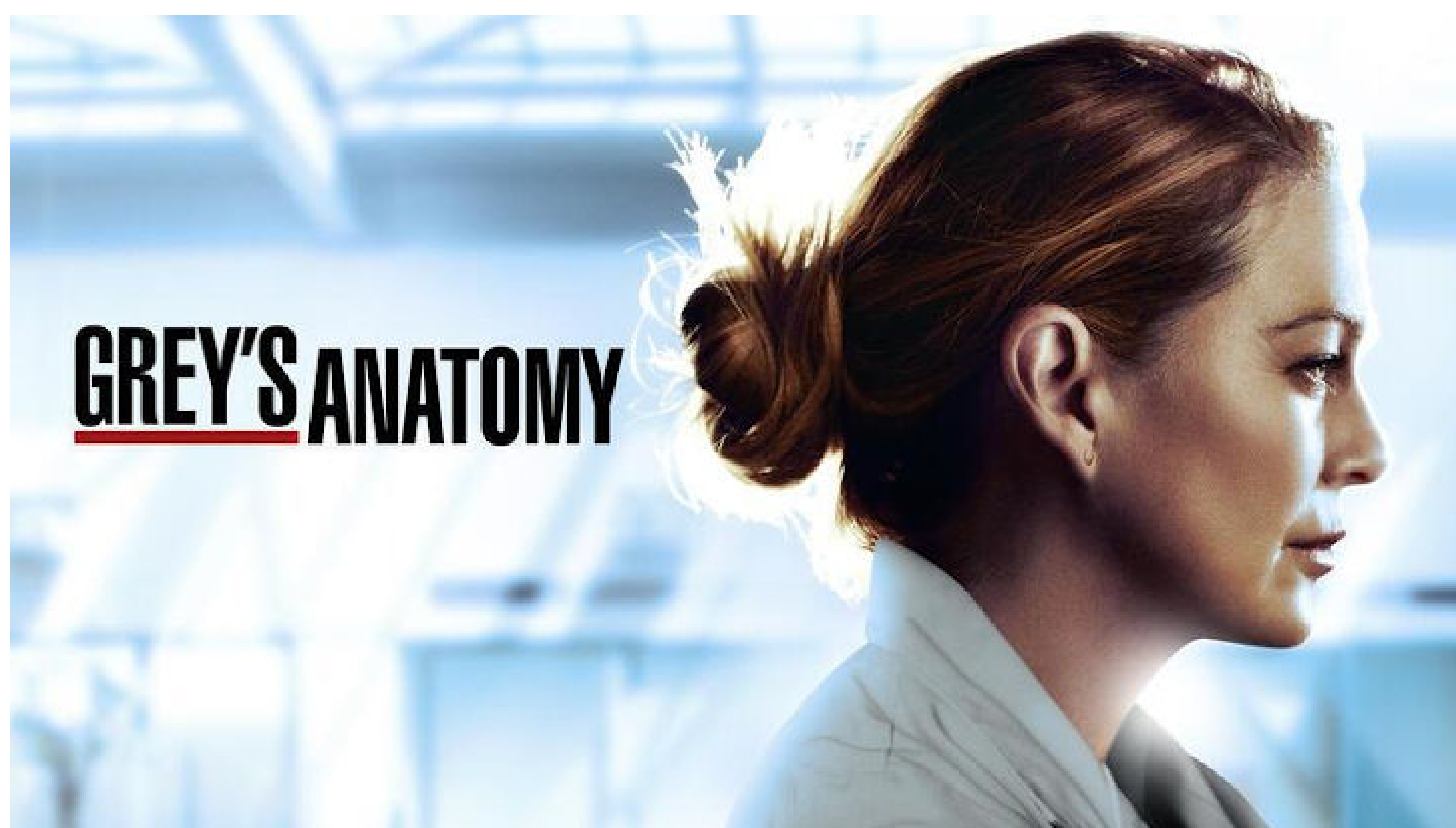
Prom 2021
