Boiling Springs High School's Bulldog Band had a very strong showing this weekend at the South Carolina Band Director Association's Region Band Auditions. 58 Woodwind and Brass musicians auditioned for positions on the Clinic and Senior Regional Bands. 32 students have qualified for Region Band so far and 12 of those have scored high enough to audition for the All-State Band! Full region results will be available after the All-State auditions.

Region auditions require students to prepare a challenging solo, memorization of scales, and memorization of music vocabulary. Additionally, students are tested in the audition to perform a piece of music they have never seen that is scored on the same rubric as their prepared solo. They perform all of their audition for professional musicians, who score them against all other students competing in the same region.

Region auditions are a huge undertaking for each individual student and the directors are extremely proud of the preliminary results! Final results will be posted after the All-State auditions, on January 22nd.
