


We are very proud of our new facilities. I hope that everyone will get a chance to come out and support the Bulldogs and enjoy the atmosphere in our new gym!

Over the Summer and Fall workout seasons, the team has put in hard work to uphold the standard created for the program. The Lady Bulldogs were picked to finish 6th in Region II-AAAAA. This pre-season prediction has given the ladies an edge to work harder than normal. The Motto this year is "Defense wins Games". Expect to see the Lady Bulldogs getting after it on defense this season with high energy, pressuring the basketball, and causing turnovers. Returning at the guard position is four-year starter Arissa Edwards, who was a 2018-2019 All-Region Player, and was also selected as a 2019-2020 Pre-Season All-Region Player.
